SUBJECT: Certification of Exemption from Conference Approval Guidance

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN RE: POTENTIAL DOD ATTENDEES

The following event, “Addressing the Psychological Health of Warriors and Their Families” to be held May 16-20, 2016 at the Idaho National Guard Gowen Field Conference Center in Boise Idaho, has been approved as exempt from the September 23, 2015 guidance, “Implementation of Updated Conference Oversight Requirements.” This USU-sponsored event does not exhibit indicia of a conference and is directly related to Department of Defense mission; this should not be considered a conference and a conference approval package is not required. Exemptions from conference guidance are granted sparingly and only when events fully meet the definition and intent of the criteria. The basis of the exemption for this event is “4.e. Formal classroom training.” You may share the information in this letter with your prospective attendees.

This approval is contingent on continued attention to ensure the best use of government funds and adherence with all applicable policy. You are still expected to continue to apply strict scrutiny to ensure the best use of government funds and adherence with not only all applicable laws and policy, but the underlying spirit or principles, including ensuring that only personnel attend events who have a mission-essential need to do so, that expenses be kept to a minimum,
