

The Deployment Cycle and Its Impact on Service Members and Their Families

Recorded Asynchronous Distance

Description:

This training is designed for civilian behavioral health providers who want to learn about the impact deployments have on all members of a military family. It explores the unique experiences that Service members, spouses, and children face by presenting research findings and reviewing psychosocial stressors associated with each stage of the deployment cycle.

<u>Instructional Format</u>: This course is a pre-recorded webinar that is available on the Center for Deployment Psychology's website. The participant will watch the full recorded video and take an online post-test

Continuing Education:

Course Completion Requirements: Participants are required to *watch the full recording*, pass the post-test with a 75% or greater score, and complete the post-training evaluation to obtain CE credit.
