

Military-Connected Couples: Evidence-Based Approaches to Treatment

Recorded Asynchronous Distance

Description:

This training provides behavioral health providers with information about evidenced-based interventions that can be used with military and veteran couples. It begins with a review of the basic demographics of military couples and a discussion of normative stressors associated with military marriages as well as the impact of deployment on couples. Then three evidence-based couples interventions derived from Dr. John Gottman, Dr. Sue Johnson and other experts are presented with explanation of ways they can be used with military and veteran couples. The training concludes with an exploration of relationship strengths and resilience factors, with an emphasis on promoting resilience in military couples.

Instructional Format: This course is a pre-recorded webinar that is available on the Center for Deployment Psychology's website. The participant will watch the full recorded video and take an online post-test
