How to Become a Provider

- Providers must be TRICARE-certified in order to file claims and receive payment for TRICARE services.
- Certified providers must meet the licensing and certification requirements of TRICARE regulations and practice for that area of healthcare.

Military One Source

About

- Department of Defense-funded program that's both a call center and a website
- Provides comprehensive information on every aspect of military life for free to active duty, National Guard and Reserve Component service members (regardless of activation status), their families and survivors.
 - Information includes, deployment, reunion and reintegration, relationship, grief, spouse employment and education, parenting, childcare
- Common topics addressed during non-medical face-to-face counseling: parenting, marital issues, stress management, deployment and adjustment concerns, and coping with grief or loss.
- Service members and their family can request a non- medical face-to-face counseling session by calling a consultant at Military OneSource at 800-342-9647

How to Become a Provider:

• Must possess a master's degree or higher in counseling, social work, psychology, or related mental health professional

• Provides free, confidential mental and physical health services to post-9/11 war zone veterans, service members, and their families in Oregon and Southwest Washington.

How to Become a Provider

- Hold a current license in good standing that is authorized by the appropriate state licensing board in Oregon and/or Washington.
- Be covered by current malpractice insurance for your practice.
- Review the Provider Agreement and submit the Volunteer Provider Application.
- Participate in a Welcome Call and complete two hours of online orientation.

Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC)

About

- Department of Defense-funded program that provides confidential, short-term, non-medical counseling services for up to 12 sessions per person, per issue.
- Aimed at preventing the development or exacerbation of mental health conditions that may detract from military and family readiness.
- MFLCs confidential, non-medical counseling offers services face-to-face, and on and off military installations worldwide.
- Active-duty service members, National Guard and Reserve members and their immediate family members are eligible for services.
- Veterans and their immediate families are eligible up to 180 days post-separation from the military.
- Surviving non-remarried spouses and their children are eligible for services as well.

To Become a Provider:

- All counselors (those in rotational employee positions as well as network providers in on-demand and surge assignments) must meet certain quality and credentialing requirements, including
 - Evidence of independent licensure
 - Confirmation of education
 - Successful completion of a criminal history background check including fingerprints
 - Successful completion of a drug screen (employees only)
 - Successful completion of a comprehensive MFLC training program
